Is Professor in the School of Population and Public Health at the University of British Columbia in Canada, Director of the PhD and MSc programs, and Theme Lead for Maternal Child Health.

She focuses on perinatal epidemiology – she does research into various aspects of perinatal care and their impact on maternal and newborn health. She is also in charge of the Optimal Birth BC programme, which is aimed at optimizing the rate of caesarean birth in all hospitals in British Columbia.

She wrote two significant publications - <u>Outcomes of Planned Home Birth with Registered Midwife versus Planned Hospital Birth with Midwife or Physician</u> and <u>Costs of Planned Home vs. Hospital Birth in British Columbia Attended by Registered Midwives and Physicians</u>, in which she demonstrates that home births attended by registered midwives are safe and cost-effective.
